Su colección documenta los movimientos de izquierda en Puerto Rico y de los puertorriqueños en Estados Unidos y es un recurso importante para conocer el rol del PSP ante la Organización de Naciones Unidas (ONU), el robo de la Wells Fargo en Hartford y las luchas por liberar a los prisioneros políticos puertorriqueños. RAFAEL ANGLADA LOPEZ (1950-)

Biographical Note:

Rafael Anglada López is a lawyer and a civil rights activist. He was a member of the *Federación de Universitarios Pro Independencia (FUPI-Federation of Pro-Independence University Students)*, a delegate for the Puerto Rican Socialist Party before the United Nations, and a reporter for *Claridad*, the major pro-independence newspaper. Anglada has dedicated his life to the struggle for Puerto Rican independence from the United States and, as an attorney, defending the rights of political dissidents.

Anglada was born June 4, 1950. His mother, Gladys Paulina López Cabrera, was a medical secretary and his father, Jaime William Anglada Pérez worked for the Department of Education of the Government of Puerto Rico. The family lived in Santurce during his childhood and then moved to Río Piedras, where he enrolled in the prestigious University of Puerto Rico High School.

During his high school years, he was inclined toward activism and discovered an affinity with leftist and revolutionary causes. The Vietnam War and the student protests at the University of Puerto Rico (UPR) raised his awareness and sparked his interest in political issues. Consequently, he joined a pro-independence student group along with individuals like Juan Manuel Carrión Morales, Ricardo Alegría, Jr., Alejandro Ortíz, Cynthia Ferrer, Jorge Hernández and Karl Fromm.

While Anglada's political activism began in high school, it was his entry into the Río Piedras campus of the UPR in 1967, which would shape his future course. At the start of his academic career, he refrained from joining any of the militant leftist groups on campus, although he participated in a hunger strike that lasted eleven days and had been organized by Miguel Pérez de Otero, President of the *Juventud Independentista Universitaria* (University Youth for Independence). Gradually he became more involved and before the end of his freshman year, he had become a member of the *FUPI*. By the spring of 1970, Anglada became more radical in his politics and assumed a leadership role in the *FUPI*, serving as its Secretary of Finance. Among his accomplishments was developing fund raising strategies for the *FUPI* such as the sale of leftist books on campus

Nota biográfica:

Rafael Anglada López es un abogado y activista de los derechos humanos y civiles. Fue miembro de la Federación de Universitarios Pro Independencia (FUPI), delegado del Partido Socialista Puertorriqueño (PSP) ante la Organización de Naciones Unidas (ONU) y reportero de *Claridad*. Su vida la ha dedicado a luchar por la independencia de Puerto Rico.



Anglada nació el 4 de Junio de 1950. Su madre, Gladys Paulina López Cabrera, era secretaria médica y su padre, Jaime William Anglada Pérez, trabajó para el Departamento de Educación del gobierno de Puerto Rico. La familia residía en Santurce en sus años de infancia y luego se trasladaron a Río Piedras durante su adolescencia. Esa mudanza coincidió con su ingreso a la Escuela Superior de la Universidad de Puerto Rico (UPR), una escuela modelo afiliada al primer centro docente del país.

Durante sus años escolares, empezó a manifestarse su inclinación por el activismo y a descubrir su afinidad con los grupos de la izquierda. La Guerra de Vietnam y las protestas estudiantiles de la UPR, le hicieron tomar conciencia e interés por las causas políticas. En la escuela superior fue integrante del grupo de estudiantes que compartían ideas independentistas. Entre ellos se encontraban Juan Manuel Carrión Morales, Ricardo Alegría (hijo), Alejandro Ortíz, Cynthia Ferrer, Jorge Hernández y Karl Fromm.

Ingresó al Recinto de Río Piedras de la UPR en 1967.

and a wider distribution of the newspaper, *Claridad*. In the summer of 1970, he joined the Victoria de Girón Brigade and went to Cuba to help with the sugar cane harvest with several close associates including Lipio Vélez Velares, founder of the *Movimiento Pro Independencia* (MPI), which would later become the *Partido Socialista Puertorriqueño* (PSP-Socialist Party of Puerto Rico).

In October of that same year, he was expelled from the UPR. Along with other members of the *FUPI*, he was persecuted by the police and forced to go into hiding as a consequence of the burning of the ROTC building on the Río Piedras campus.

From 1971-1973 Anglada represented the *FUPI* in Prague, Czechoslovakia where he attended a world youth conference and met with leaders of groups such as the International Student Union, The World Federation of Democratic Youth and the World Peace Council. The two years he spent in Prague were important for his political work and he was able to bring the issue of Puerto Rican independence to the international arena and to place it on the Soviet agenda. These years were personally gratifying and included trips to countries such as North Korea and North Vietnam and meetings with world leaders such as Amílcar Cabral, a key figure in the African independence movement. In 1973, before returning to Puerto Rico, he attended the Tenth World Youth Festival in East Berlin.

Upon his return to Puerto Rico, Juan Mari Brás, Secretary General of the PSP named him Party representative to the United Nations. Anglada moved to New York and he worked as a delegate alongside José Antonio González y González from September until March 1978. At the UN he labored tirelessly presenting and lobbying for resolutions in favor of the decolonization of Puerto Rico. In that time period, the PSP forged ties with the Communist Party of the United States and together they organized activities such as the “Bicentennial Without Colonies” and two “International Solidarity Conferences for the Independence of Puerto Rico” held in Havana, Cuba in 1975 and in México City in 1979.

In 1977, Anglada returned to Puerto Rico and took advantage of an amnesty offered by the UPR to students who had been expelled for political reasons. He completed his BA degree in the social sciences and was admitted to the UPR’s Law School, attending classes

Al comenzar en la universidad no perteneció a ningún grupo de la izquierda, aunque sí participó en la huelga de hambre que por once días organizó José Miguel Pérez de Otero, Presidente a la Juventud Independentista Universitaria. A finales de ese año, se integró “con el alma” a la *FUPI*. En la primavera de 1970, Anglada se radicalizó y comenzó a trabajar como Secretario de Finanzas de la *FUPI*. Estableció la venta de libros de izquierda pro fondos de la *FUPI* en la UPR y recorrió la isla distribuyendo *Claridad*. Junto a Karl Fromm, Carmen Parrilla (sobrina del Arzobispo Antulio Parrilla, s.j.) y el campesino Lipio Vélez Velares (fundador del *Movimiento Pro Independencia MPI*), fueron a Cuba a cortar caña como parte de la brigada latinoamericana Victoria de Girón, en el verano de 1970. Ese mismo año en el mes de octubre fue expulsado de la universidad. Al año siguiente, se tuvo que esconder de la policía que estaba persiguiendo a miembros de la *FUPI*, como consecuencia de la quema del edificio de la Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) del Recinto de Río Piedras de la UPR.

De 1971 a 1973 representó a la *FUPI* en Praga, Checoslovaquia donde tuvo la oportunidad de reunirse con los líderes de distintas entidades como la Unión Internacional de Estudiantes, la Federación Mundial de la Juventud Democrática, y el Consejo Mundial para la Paz. Sus dos años en Praga fueron sumamente importantes porque se dedicó a gestionar que la independencia de Puerto Rico se incluyera en la agenda pro-soviética. Además fueron años “muy bonitos” porque visitó países como Corea del Norte y Vietnam del Norte y conoció a líderes como Amílcar Cabral, uno de los padres de la independencia africana. Antes de regresar a Puerto Rico en 1973, acudió al Décimo Festival Mundial de la Juventud de los Estudiantes en Berlín, Alemania Oriental.

Al regresar a Puerto Rico, Juan Mari Brás, Secretario General del PSP lo nombró como el representante de la organización en la ONU. En la ciudad de Nueva York trabajó junto a José Antonio González-González conocido como “El Profe”, desde Septiembre de 1973 a Marzo de 1978. En la ONU, gestionó la aprobación de resoluciones a favor de la Descolonización de Puerto Rico. Durante esa época el PSP forjó vínculos con el Partido Comunista de los Estados Unidos que posibilitaron la celebración de actividades como el Bicentenario sin colonias en Filadelfia, las Conferencias Internacionales de Solidaridad con la Independencia de Puerto Rico celebradas en la Habana en 1975 y en la

during the day and working nights as a reporter for *Claridad*. He finished Law School in 1982 and returned to New York where he was employed at the Center for Constitutional Rights. Anglada later participated as a defense attorney in the notorious case against members of “*Los Macheteros*,” a pro independence group whose members were accused of robbing seven million dollars from the Wells Fargo depot in West Hartford, Connecticut.

Since 1989 Anglada has been in Puerto Rico practicing as a criminal lawyer in the Federal Court system. He remains strongly committed to the cause of Puerto Rican independence and is active on behalf of the case of Puerto Rico before the UN Decolonization Committee.

The Rafael Anglada Papers are an important resource for documenting leftist movements and radical politics in Puerto Rico and the United States. They are particularly informative regarding the role of the Puerto Rican Socialist Party in the United Nations. His work with Puerto Rican political prisoners is also well documented.

A finales de 1977, Anglada regresó a Puerto Rico y aprovechó la decisión de la Junta de Síndicos de la UPR de readmitir a los estudiantes que habían sido expulsados en los setenta. Terminó los doce créditos que le faltaban y finalmente obtuvo su bachillerato en Ciencias Sociales. Posteriormente fue admitido en la Escuela de Derecho de la UPR. Mientras cursaba sus estudios de leyes, Anglada continuó trabajando como reportero para *Claridad* hasta 1982.

Al culminar sus estudios de Derecho regresó a Nueva York y trabajó para el Center for Constitutional Rights. También, participó como abogado defensor en el caso de los prisioneros políticos, miembros del Ejército Popular Boricua mejor conocidos como “*Los Macheteros*”. Estos prisioneros políticos estaban acusados del robo de siete millones de las oficinas de la Wells Fargo en Hartford, Connecticut.

Regresó a Puerto Rico en 1989 y desde ese entonces continúa ejerciendo como abogado criminalista en la Corte Federal. Anglada mantiene vivo su compromiso con la lucha de la independencia de Puerto Rico. Como parte de ese compromiso continua abogando porque el Comité de Descolonización retenga el caso de Puerto Rico en su agenda.

Su colección es importante porque documenta los movimientos de izquierda en Puerto Rico y de los puertorriqueños en Estados Unidos. Los documentos de Anglada son un excelente recurso para conocer el rol del PSP ante la ONU y las luchas por liberar a los prisioneros políticos puertorriqueños.

Scope and Content:

Rafael Anglada's collection captures the militancy and turbulence of the Puerto Rican movement for independence particularly during the 1970s. The papers document the history of leftist movements in Puerto Rico as well as in the Puerto Rican communities of the United States. Of great significance is the information on the history of the PSP in the United States, where it had a branch and also published a bilingual edition of its newspaper, *Claridad*. Other major themes of the Papers are the decolonization of Puerto Rico as an issue before the UN, the Wells Fargo robbery in Hartford, and Puerto Rican political prisoners.

The bulk of the material is from the 1970s and 1980s. The folders are organized alphabetically and the documents are arranged chronologically. Types of materials include letters, memoranda, reports, pamphlets and newspaper clippings.

Alcance y contenido:

La colección de Rafael Anglada contiene información sobre la historia de los movimientos de izquierda tanto en Puerto Rico como en la comunidad puertorriqueña de Estados Unidos. Los materiales amplían la información disponible sobre la historia del PSP en Estados Unidos, el caso sobre el robo de la Wells Fargo en Hartford, Connecticut y el tema de la descolonización de Puerto Rico en la ONU.

La mayoría de los materiales se concentran en las décadas de los setenta a los ochenta. Los cartapacios están organizados en orden alfabético y los documentos están ordenados cronológicamente. Los tipos de documentos son cartas, memorandos, informes, panfletos y recortes de periódicos.

Series II: Correspondence (1971-1989)

This series consists of letters, telegrams and memoranda separated into outgoing and incoming. Most of the letters pertain to the period that Anglada was a UN delegate for the PSP and contain a great many greetings and notes from ambassadors and international organizations. For the most part, the series documents the case for the decolonization of Puerto Rico, summit meetings of non-aligned countries, and Anglada’s numerous contacts with Socialist countries.

Serie II: Correspondencia (1971-1989)

La serie está compuesta por cartas, memorandos y telegramas. Tanto las cartas como los memorandos están divididos en enviados y recibidos. La mayoría de las cartas pertenecen al período cuando Anglada era el delegado del PSP ante la ONU. Es por eso, que hay una gran cantidad de felicitaciones y cartas de agradecimientos de diversos embajadores y organizaciones internacionales. En general, los documentos proveen información sobre el tema de descolonización de Puerto Rico, las cumbres de los países no alineados y sus contactos en los países socialistas.

Series III: Writings (1971-1989)

Among the items included here are notes, articles, presentations and speeches. Notable among the writings are his articles as a correspondent for *Claridad* in New York, and items having to do with his representation of the PSP, which focused on the case of Puerto Rico before the UN Decolonization Committee. Anglada also wrote for the column “Black and White” in *el diario/La Prensa*, New York’s premier Spanish language daily.

Serie III: Escritos (1971-1989)

Entre sus escritos encontramos notas, artículos, ponencias y discursos. Sobresalen sus artículos periodísticos como corresponsal del periódico *Claridad* en Nueva York y su participación como representante del PSP ante la ONU. También escribió varios artículos en la columna “Blanco y Negro” del *el diario/La Prensa*, el rotativo hispano más importante de la ciudad.

Series VI: Political Prisoners (1971-1991)

This series contains a large number of newspaper articles in addition to newsletters, biographical sketches, pamphlets, flyers and legal information. These materials document militant, pro-independence activities in the U.S. and Puerto Rico by groups such as the *Fuerzas Armadas de Liberación Nacional (FALN)*, the *Ejército Popular Boricua (Macheteros)* and the Nationalist Party. Most of the information concerns the case against individuals accused of the robbery of the Wells Fargo Depot in Hartford, Connecticut in 1983, and their defense and imprisonment. Anglada was a member of the defense team. There are also materials about the nationalist Oscar Collazo, imprisoned for his attack on Blair House in 1950, and four other nationalists, Andrés Cordero, Lolita Lebrón, Irvin Flores and Rafael Cancel Miranda imprisoned for an attack on the U.S. Congress in 1954.

Serie VI: Prisioneros políticos (1971-1991)

Esta serie documenta varios grupos militantes partidarios de la independencia de Puerto Rico como las Fuerzas Armadas de Liberación Nacional (FALN), el Ejército Popular Boricua (Macheteros) y los miembros del Partido Nacionalista. Contiene entre los documentos, una gran cantidad de artículos de prensa y boletines, reseñas biográficas, panfletos, volantes e información de los casos legales de estos puertorriqueños. La mayoría de los materiales es sobre los acusados de ser participantes en los robos en las facilidades de la Wells Fargo en Hartford, Connecticut en 1983, su defensa y eventual encarcelamiento. También tiene información sobre los cinco nacionalistas, Oscar Collazo encarcelado por el ataque a la Casa Blair (residencia temporera del Presidente de Estados Unidos en Washington en 1950) y de Andrés Cordero, Lolita Lebrón, Irvin Flores y Rafael Cancel Miranda por el tiroteo en el Congreso de Estados Unidos en 1954.
